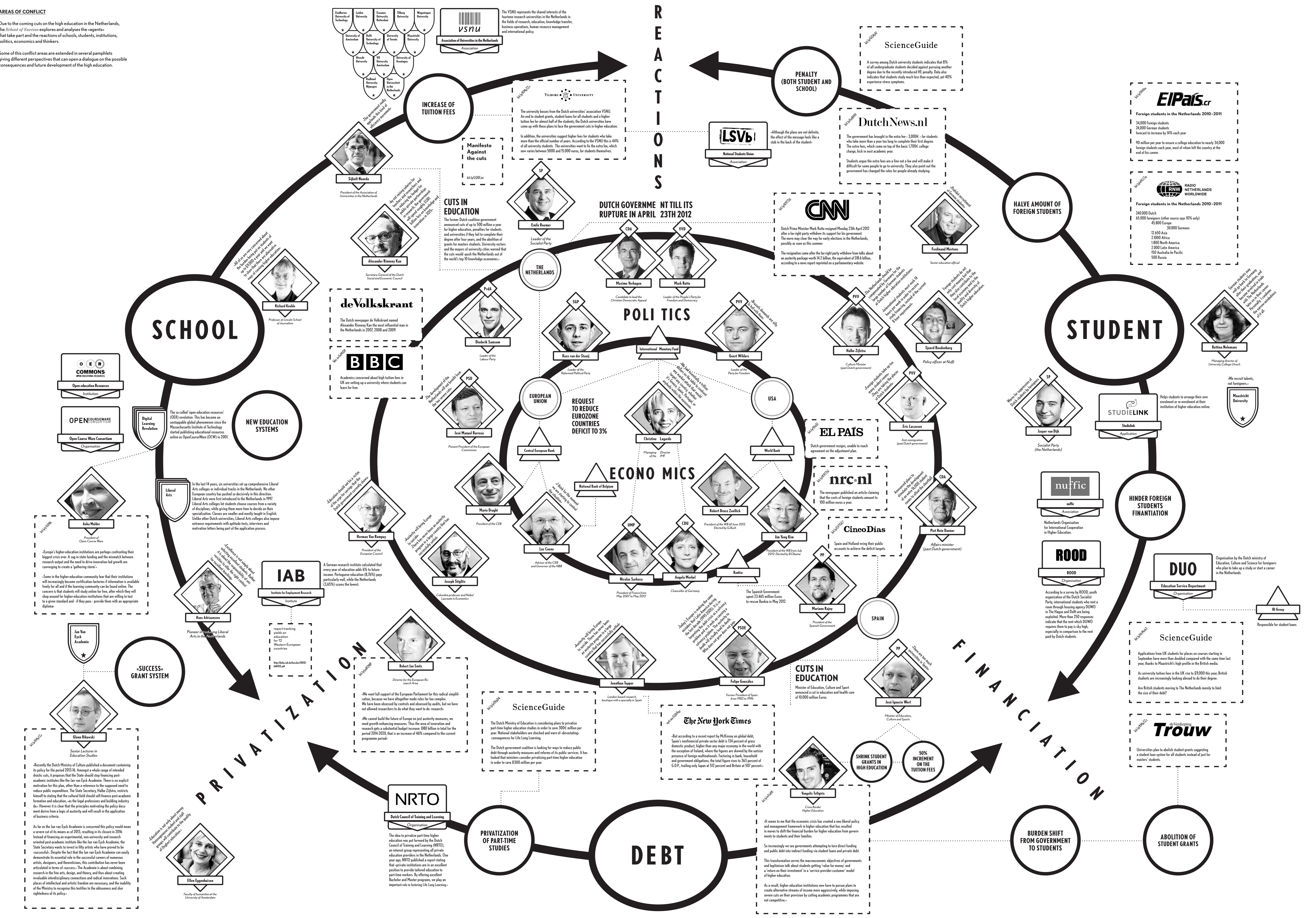


AREAS OF CONFLICT
